Introduction:

In our current practice climate, a much emphasized mandate to the psychiatric profession is efficiency in diagnosing, treatment planning, achieving optimal functioning, and discharging. "Psychiatric treatment" frequently appears synonymous with the prescribing of psychotropic medications. Although this paradigm has stimulated new biological interventions, many patients and practitioners find that it overlooks the essential role of listening. We must find ways to continue to listen to our patients as we both adapt to and change the realities in which we practice.

Program:

This program will emphasize the essential contributions of the foundations of good psychoanalytic and psychodynamic practice to the mental health of our patients. Presenters and discussants will reflect the diverse culture of San Diego and the international community. Presentations will be rich in ideas from different fields of science and research and will include systems theories, constructivism, sociology, biology, and neurology.

Conference Learning Objectives:

We are calling for papers from a wide variety of disciplines including philosophy, psychopharmacology, attachment theory, evolution, the humanities and religion. Presentations will integrate knowledge in these areas with psychoanalytically-oriented psychodynamic practice, education, research as well as with biologically-based psychiatry to promote the effectiveness of our clinical work.

We will compare differing psychoanalytic schools of thought, present evidence-based treatment models, and examine psychoanalytic thinking in the context of other treatment models. The roles of psychobiology and new technologies, issues encountered in teaching psychotherapy to residents, and technical implications of new theoretical approaches to psychotherapy will be presented.

Papers, panels, and workshops will explore areas of integration essential to the continued growth of the psychodynamic clinical perspective and will include work with families, different social groups and cultures. They will be relevant for psychiatric residents and mental health professionals interested in practice, teaching and research.

At the conclusion of this meeting, participants will have increased their knowledge and clinical expertise in and ramifications of integrating the biological and psychodynamic approaches in areas such as Hurricane Katrina, psychoanalytic and psychodynamic education, cultural psychiatry, core competencies in psychiatric education, among other areas.

Psychiatrists, allied mental health professionals, trainees, and others interested in the application and continuing evolution of the psychodynamic perspective.
